Each of these individuals, whether making profession of faith or transferring from another church, has affirmed or reaffirmed to the Session these membership vows we ask of everyone. They answer them again publicly for your encouragement and as a reminder of your own vows and confession of faith.

- 1. Do you acknowledge yourselves to be sinners in the sight of God, justly deserving His displeasure, and without hope save in His sovereign mercy?
- 2. Do you believe in the Lord Jesus Christ as the Son of God, and Savior of sinners, and do you receive and rest upon Him alone for salvation as He is offered in the Gospel?
- 3. Do you now resolve and promise, in humble reliance upon the grace of the Holy Spirit, that you will endeavor to live as becomes the followers of Christ?
- 4. Do you promise to support the Church in its worship and work to the best of your ability?
- 5. Do you submit yourselves to the government and discipline of the Church, and promise to study its purity and peace?

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

For children joining the Covenant Community, we ask these questions of their believing parents:

- 1. Do you acknowledge your children's need of the cleansing blood of Jesus Christ, and the renewing grace of the Holy Spirit?
- 2. Do you claim God's covenant promises in their behalf, and do you look in faith to the Lord Jesus Christ for their salvation, as you do for your own?
- 3. Do you now unreservedly dedicate your children to God, and promise, in humble reliance upon divine grace, that you will endeavor to set before them a godly example, that you will pray with and for them, that you will teach them the doctrines of our holy religion, and that you will strive, by all the means of God's appointment, to bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord?

To the congregation, we ask:

Do you as a congregation undertake the responsibility of assisting the parents in the Christian nurture of these children?

* CONFESSION OF FAITH

I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth;

And in Jesus Christ his only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried; he descended into hell*; the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence he shall come to judge the quick* and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Ghost; the holy catholic⁺ Church; the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting. Amen.

Though not written by the apostles, the Apostles' Creed is a concise summary of their teachings dating back to the 2nd century.

* - traditionally this phrase refers to either (1) the fact that on the cross Jesus bore the wrath of God against sin (i.e., hell) or (2) emphasizes the fact that Jesus was truly dead (i.e., hell was often used to translate hades, the grave or place of the dead).

+ - quick means "living"; catholic means "universal"
